Induction Week

The staff and teachers of the Universal Academy of Pittsburgh completed the Induction Weeks' workshops, which lasted for two weeks (August 5-16). Several remarkable presenters led workshops that covered various professional development topics closely related to the school's programs, teachers, staff, students, and the community.



PSSA Testing

The Universal Academy of Pittsburgh decided to transition from Stanford Achievement Test to the PSSA (Pennsylvania System of School Assessment) for the following reasons:

- Lack of Public Data: Stanford test results from other schools are not publicly available, limiting the ability to compare performance between UAP and other schools.
- Alignment with Standards: The Stanford test is not aligned with Pennsylvania State Common Core

- PSSA is specifically designed to assess students according to these standards.
- Score Reporting: The Stanford test uses a more complex statistical measure to report scores. In contrast, the PSSA uses four easily understandable scoring levels: Advanced, Proficient, Basic, and Below Basic.
- Grade Levels and Scheduling: The PSSA is administered to students in grades 3 through 8 and is scheduled for April 2025.

The Reading and Math specialist comes to school twice a week, on Wednesdays and Fridays, to support students by screening them to a cess their specific needs and working closely with them to povide targeted assistance.
